Meeting Summary

- 1. MVVA presented specifics on the feedback heard from the first Community Meeting held in November 2017:
 - a. In response to the prompt
 - i. Imagine 20 years from now... Question: What aspects of Raleigh's public life do you hope stay the same?
 - 1. 40% responded that they love the outdoor spaces and small town feel today
 - ii. What do you want to see improved?
 - 1. 36% responded that they wanted to see improvements to transportations and connectivity, while 27% need a place for everyone to come together
 - b. Other important park actions with public support:
 - i. creating a park for everyone, with activities for everyone
 - ii. creating new and more diverse experiences of water at Dix Park
 - iii. recreating the urban/rural threshold of Davis's center pavilion
- 2. Neighbors and Edges
 - a. MVVA walked through the perimeter of Dix Park and reviewed park neighbors with MPEC via discussion
 - i. NCSU Central Campus
 - ii. NCSU North Campus
 - iii. Pullen Park
 - iv. Governor Morehead School, MPEC notes Wake County currently leases some of this property; approx. 60 kids from county schooled there.

 - 1. It would be good to figure out a solution to support and enhance retail at the state farmers market
 - 2. "loves the cornucopia" of shopping but does not love the experience
 - 3. SFM corner is the most important to the region proximate to interstate interchange
- 3. Graphic Plan Review
 - a. Matt Urbanski presented the concept of the "Tiered Ponds" area
 - i. NC State, SFM and Dix Park working together to restore an important ecological corridor and drainage area; would become an important new entrance to the park via Centennial
 - b. Comments + Feedback:
 - i. Would want to understand the impact of moving any farmers market retail into park and consider how many trucks per day and impact to vehicular traffic
 - ii. Questions MVVA proposal to long term alteration + removal of portion of Ashe Ave at Western
 - iii. Projections for traffic show Ashe Ave being less used in the future
- 4. Introducing topics for Feb. work session. To include...
 - a. A proactive approach for pursuing and defining partners, based on the specific objectives of Dix Park
 - b. MVVA references specific objectives used on their work at Brooklyn Bridge park, how they were derived based upon community input and informed by the unique existing conditions+ urban context of the park site itself
 - c. A revisiting of the 2016 RFQ goals for the park, as composed by the City and Conservancy
