PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This summer, a partnership was formed between Conservation Corps NC (CCNC), Conservation Legacy, and Raleigh Parks to bring two CCNC Youth Conservation Corps crews to Dorothea Dix Park. These crews were funded by the Woodson Family Foundation through the Triangle Community Foundation and donors to the Dix Park Conservancy.

CCNC Youth Conservation Corp crews follow in the footsteps of the original Civilian Conservation Corps which was part of the New Deal of the 1930s. CCNC strives to engage America's future conservationist through meaningful conservation-based projects.

The CCNC Dix Park Youth Conservation Crew was a unique opportunity to meet those same goals but in an urban park setting. The crews worked on identified projects that compliment the Dix Park master plan including: Trail building, invasive plant removal, landscape maintenance, light construction in the form of new and expanded hammock groves, a GIS based project, acting as ambassadors during a special event, and much more.

The crews also experienced educational opportunities and mentor sessions from City of Raleigh staff currently working in conservation and park related roles. Some of these opportunities were: park planning, prescribed fire, birding, urban forestry, storm water management, bio fuels, job opportunities within Parks, plant identification, invasive plant species and more.

The CCNC Dix Park Youth Conservation Crew was comprised of two team leaders and a total of twelve local teenagers (15-18 years of age). Some of the crew members knew they wanted to work outdoors, while others wanted a unique experience and to learn more about parks.


ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 3,840 hours of maintenance efforts
- 1/4 Mile of trail cleared, graded, and naturalized
- 14,000 lbs. of invasive plants removed/cut down
- 3,000 sq. ft. seeded and sodded
- 120 sq. ft. of Astroturf installed
- 120 Donor Plaques mapped using GIS
- 93 Acres weed wacked
- · 65 Cemetery markers raised
- · 60 cubic ft. of mulch spread
- · 27 pieces of park furniture built
- 21 hammocks installed in 2 groves (installing posts, leveling, installing hardware)
- 8 hours of serving as Sunflower Ambassadors
- 3 bike stations installed
- 3 play stations installed
